The GFWI newsletter this month contains two items concerning our 2019 resolution to stop Violence against Women and Girls. There is a report on the Reclaim the Night march which took place in December to raise awareness, and news of talks being arranged to enable more of our members to hear about the issue and what we can do to help. It is a sobering estimate that at least 750,000 children a year witness domestic abuse, and the Government says that these children are at serious risk for long-term physical and mental health problems. **What can we do:** Be aware of the possibility of domestic abuse around us and report any concerns as appropriate.
