There are over 30,000 cardiac arrests occurring in the UK outside hospitals and fewer than 1 in 10 people survive. What can we do? **Be prepared** to help in an emergency by signing up to the training sessions we are intending to run in October or using the British Heart Foundation's online training ([Learn CPR in 15 minutes for free | RevivR - BHF](#)). **Know where** our local defibrillators are - Co-op, rail station, public toilets, St David's centre, Cricket club, Football club, also inside Moreton Area Centre, Tesco and the school. **Pass this** information on to friends and family - it could be you who needs their help.
