In 2019 the WI launched a campaign No More Violence Against Women with the aim of raising awareness and taking action to end all forms of violence against women. The prevalence of such abuse (not just physical violence but also emotional, financial, mental abuse, threats etc) is staggering - the latest figures from the ONS estimate that 1.6m women experienced domestic abuse in the year to March 2024, broadly 1 in every 20 women! What can we do: Be aware that domestic abuse can happen anywhere - in villages as well as in cities, in any social class, perhaps even in our own family or circle of friends. Offer support - if you are concerned about your own or someone else's situation, contact GDASS (Gloucestershire Domestic Abuse Support Service) on 01452 726570 for advice and support. Learn more - GDASS has lots of information on its website www.gdass.org.uk, and the WI are hoping to hold more educational sessions concerning the campaign next Spring, one of which may be in Moreton.
